

## 2009-2010 6<sup>th</sup> Grade General Information

There are no registration fees for 6<sup>th</sup> grade students. If your student chooses to purchase a yearbook, PE Clothes or needs to rent an instrument, these may be taken care of at the Financial office on Friday, August 14<sup>th</sup> from 9 am to 4 pm, Monday, August 17<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday, August 18<sup>th</sup> from 11 am to 6 pm. Please be sure to **BRING YOUR CLASS SCHEDULE**.

**THERE ARE NO REGISTRATION FEES FOR 6<sup>TH</sup> GRADE STUDENTS. YOUR STUDENT MAY CHOOSE TO PURCHASE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS:**

**INSTRUMENT RENTAL FEE** ..... \$40.00

All students using school-owned musical instruments should pay this fee at registration. If there is a problem, this may be paid on a semester basis - - \$20.00 at the beginning of school and \$20.00 in January. There are no flutes, trumpets, clarinets, alto saxophones or violins available for rent.

**DRUM RENTAL** ..... \$40.00

All students must have a receipt noting payment of instrument rental or fee waiver to obtain instruments for Band.

**P.E. CLOTHES** ..... \$20.00

The standard P.E. uniform required for 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students is not required for 6<sup>th</sup> grade students. However, they are available to those who wish to purchase them at the school and should last all three years for many of our students.

If you do not wish to purchase a school uniform, your child will need to bring their own blue shorts and blue short-sleeved T-shirt of comparable standards.

**YEARBOOK (optional)** ..... \$15.00

After December 31<sup>st</sup> ..... \$20.00

The yearbook is optional; however, it is advisable and highly recommended to pay for it the first or second day of school. Students will receive their yearbook on the last day of school.

After the first day of school, lunch money for all of your Mount Logan Middle School students may be paid with the same check. Please continue to note Ala Carte cards on your check. (For example: If you make your check for \$18.50 you should note on the bottom: \$13.50-lunch money, \$5.00-Ala Carte card).

Breakfast will be served every morning in the South Cafeteria from 7:50 am until 8:15 am. Breakfast will not be available on August 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>.

### Medical Needs Statements

### School Breakfast and Lunch Procedure

Lunch will be served the first day of school and every day thereafter. **Deposits can be made to your student's lunch account and Ala Carte cards will be sold each day before school in the cafeteria. Please send a separate check for each student's lunch money.** (For example: If you have twins, you will need a check for each child). If your student would like to purchase an Ala Carte card when they pay their lunch money, please note on the bottom of the check that an Ala Carte card may also be purchased. We cannot give change on checks. Ala Carte cards can be used to purchase cookies, donuts, juice, ice cream, etc.

### Utah's Policy On Public School Busing

The State of Utah requires the school district to provide free busing for students in grades K-6 living beyond one and one-half miles from school and students in grades 7-12 living beyond two miles. Students living closer to schools are ineligible for busing.

Students who qualify for free busing will get on the bus at their appropriate bus stop. Tickets and cards will not be used this year. **Bus routes for eligible students will be printed in the Herald Journal the week before school opens.** A list of bus routes will also be available at the school.
